**Dr. Nomalanga Dalili
Educator and Activist**



Nomalanga Dalili was born in Bradenton, Florida and raised in San Diego California. She was the first student to integrate her elementary school, and at the age of 11 she began organizing with the Black Federation. Nomalanga Dalili joined the All African People's Revolutionary Party a vocal organization in the Pan African Movement, as a student at San Diego State University. While in the Party, Nomalanga served as the All African Women's Revolutionary Union Chapter Coordinator in California, New York, Pennsylvania and Maryland. Nomalanga has spoken at San Diego State University, Laney College, Cornell University, University of Chicago, University of Pennsylvania, Temple University, Howard University, University of Maryland in Baltimore, and the University of Delaware. Nomalanga Dalili received her PhD from the University of Pennsylvania. Her study is ethnography about African women born in America, and their participation in West African dance. Dr. Dalili is married and has three daughters. She presently lives in Baltimore Maryland. Nomalanga Dalili is available to speak on topics such as socialism and African women's activism, Pan-Africanism, the worldwide student movement, and revolution and religion.
